# Building Resilience and Adaption to Climate Extremes and Disasters (BRACED/ANUKULAN)

BRACED/ANUKULAN is a DFID funded programme that focus on elements like Income, Food security, Access to services related to livelihood security, Access to sufficient water, Access to climate-adaptive technologies, and Health for food security and resilience building. The programme is led by iDE-UK, whereas RIMS-Nepal is responsible to take a principal role in agriculture related climate change adaptation and livelihoods components as well as support in DRR components in Bardiya.

#### **Goal & Impact**

The programme aims to enable the vulnerable poor, especially women and children, in Nepal to be more resilient to climate extremes and disasters.

- Increase the annual income for 100,000 households (benefiting over 500,000 people) by £140 (NPR 22,300).
- Promote the integration of DRR and Climate Change Adaptation measures.
- Reduce the proportion of children under five suffering from malnutrition, through climate resilient farming systems and diversification of livelihoods.
- Empower women, as measured by the WEAI, to take leading roles in rural institutions contributing to economic opportunities.


